INNOVATING TO END HUNGER

1998

FOOD PANTRY NETWORK

We were one of the first Food Banks to launch weekly pantries focused on neighborhoods with greatest need. These farmers market-style pantries are now the cornerstone of our food distribution.



2000

FARM TO FAMILY

We cultivated direct relationships with farmers and packers, greatly increasing our fresh produce distribution. Today the program is statewide.

HEALTHY CHILDREN PANTRIES

To reach more families with children, we were the first Food Bank to expand the Pantry Network to schools.

CALFRESH OUTREACH

We started helping community members enroll in CalFresh (food stamps), one of the best ways to tackle hunger.

HOME-DELIVERED GROCERIES

We expanded this program citywide to support the health and self-sufficiency of homebound neighbors.

FOOD PHARMACIES

We began collaborating with health clinics to connect patients with free groceries, nutrition education, and CalFresh.

COLLEGE PANTRIES

Every week, the Food Bank now provides students with healthy food and CalFresh support to fight hunger and boost academic achievement.
