



“Missing Meals” in Marin

In Marin, **19%** of the population is at risk of food insecurity. That's **47,700 people** living below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level.

Collectively, they need **52 million meals** throughout the year — 3 meals a day, for 365 days.


Some of those meals they buy themselves, and others are provided by non-profit organizations and government assistance programs.

TRENDS: Marin


We are seeing 23% more meals needed in 2017 than in 2009.

The number of meals provided by non-profit and government has remained largely steady in recent years, after a significant jump after the recession. Together, the two sectors provide 29% of the total meals needed.

There are still **10.5 million meals** missing in Marin, and we have lots of work to do to close the meal gap.

10.5 million meals are “missing” in Marin County.
